Astronomy Service Slooh Will Let You Watch The LCROSS Impact Live On October 9

Slooh, a service that offers unfettered access to two huge earth-based telescopes, is inviting folks to [watch the LCROSS impact](#) on Friday at 4:30am PDT or 7:30am EDT. The feed begins at 3:30am PDT.

The Lunar CRater Observation and Sensing Satellite will hit the moon to create a crater 14 meters in diameter and 2 meters deep. The resulting analysis will help assess how large bodies will damage planets along with an assessment of current water levels in the moon. Plus it involves blowing holes in the moon.
